

Bible Reading Journals

One of the easiest ways to help kids develop the spiritual discipline of Bible reading is to encourage them to create a Bible Reading Journal.

Supplies:

- Blank notebooks or journals
- Washi tape in colorful patterns
- Duct tape in colorful patterns
- Permanent markers
- Pencils
- Bible Reading Prompts bookmarks

Instructions:

1. Give each kid a blank notebook or journal. Allow kids to decorate their notebook with the art supplies mentioned above. Remind them to write their name on the front!
2. Provide each kid with a Bible Reading Prompts bookmark (below). Explain that the prompts will help them to better understand the Bible, and help them apply Scripture to their own lives.
3. Challenge kids to read one section or chapter of a book in the Bible each day. Ask them to use their journals to record what they are learning!

Use these Bible Reading Prompts as you read through the Bible. Answer these questions in a Bible Reading Journal to record what you are learning each day.

1. Who is this passage about?

2. What was God doing in this passage?

3. Is there a command in this passage I should obey? What is that command?

4. Do I have a question about the passage? Write them down.
